Deer Hunting Information

Welcome to Lake Nettie National Wildlife Refuge

Lake Nettie National Wildlife Refuge (NWR) is managed by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service. The Refuge is one of over 535 refuges in the National Wildlife Refuge System – a network of lands set aside to conserve wildlife and habitat for people today and for generations to come.

Deer Hunting Information

Bow, Gun, and Muzzleloader

- Hunting for deer is permitted on the Refuge as described in the following sections.
- Hunting of all other wildlife species is prohibited on the Refuge.
- Lake Nettie NWR is divided into zones which are designated as Zone A and Zone B on the map.
- Zone A is open to bow, gun, and muzzleloader deer hunting with the proper state license, in accordance with state regulations, and during state seasons. Special Refuge permits are not required.
- Zone B is closed to all deer hunting.
- Hunters may walk in to retrieve deer in areas marked with no hunting zone signs (Zone B). No firearms are allowed while retrieving deer in these areas.
- Deer hunters may not drive on Refuge roads while hunting or for retrieval of deer. Hunters must park at the Refuge boundary and walk in.

- Hunters may use portable tree stands that meet state regulations. Tree stands may not be left up overnight. No permanent stands are allowed on the Refuge.
- Baiting of any kind is not allowed on the Refuge.
- Hunting from horses is not allowed on the Refuge.
- The Refuge is open for the special youth deer hunting season.
- All Federal and State hunting regulations apply.
